A Postal Order for 4s. in respect of advance of service pay, is also enclosed.

Immediately on receipt of this notice, you should inform your employer of the date upon which you are required to report for service.

NOTES

1. When you join your Unit you should take with you :—

This Enlistment Notice,

The enclosed envelope N.S. 124 completed in accordance with the directions at the top.

2. Uniform and personal kit will be issued to you after joining H.M. Forces. Any kit that you take with you should not exceed 15 lbs. in total weight and should be limited to an overcoat, change of underclothes, stout pair of boots, and personal kit, such as hair-brush, tooth-brush, soap and towel.
3. Before you leave to join your Unit you should take or send (or ask your employer to send) your Unemployment Book (including Exempt Persons Book) to the nearest Local Office of the Ministry of Labour and National Service. The Local Office should be informed why the book is being surrendered. You should keep a note of the number of the book.
4. If you are sick and unable to travel, you must obtain a certificate from your Doctor and send it by post to the Officer Commanding the Unit which you have been ordered to join, at the address given on the Enlistment Notice overleaf. The Officer Commanding may grant you sick leave, so that you can join as soon as you are fit to do so.
5. If circumstances suddenly arise, such as the illness of your wife, or a relative, which make you wish to apply for leave to delay joining for a few days, you must write to the Officer Commanding the Unit which you have been ordered to join, giving a full explanation of the circumstances which have arisen and which make it necessary for you to apply to delay your joining. The Officer Commanding may, if he thinks fit, grant you leave of absence for a reasonable period so that you can settle your private affairs.
6. If you are granted sick leave or leave of absence by the Officer Commanding, your travelling warrant should be returned at once to the Ministry of Labour and National Service Office from which it was sent, with a letter giving the reason for its return. You should retain this Enlistment Notice and the Postal Order for four shillings. A fresh travelling warrant, for use when the period of sick leave or leave of absence expires, will be issued by the Officer Commanding your Unit.
7. You must understand that you will be deemed to have been enlisted from the date on which you are required to present yourself to your Unit and unless you have obtained sick leave or leave of absence as explained above, failure to join your Unit on the appointed date will make you an absentee and you will then be liable to be arrested and brought before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction.

IF YOU ARE A MEMBER OF THE HOME GUARD, INFORM THE O.C. OF YOUR HOME GUARD UNIT OF THE DATE UPON WHICH YOU ARE REQUIRED TO REPORT FOR SERVICE.
