

Private Jack Adams No.11 Commando

Killed in action 9 June 1941 Litani River, Syria, aged 22.

KILLED IN THE MIDDLE EAST.

been killed on active service in the Middle East. The date of his death is given by the War Office as June 9.

Employed in civil life with the firm of James Jones & Sons, Ltd., timber merchants, Larbert, he was called to the colours in October, 1939, with his unit

and went abroad with his unit about seven months ago. Since then his relatives have had several communications from him, the last of which was in the form of an airgraph letter delivered a few weeks ago.

Pte. Adams took part in a variety of sporting activities in the city, but in no sphere will his loss be more keenly felt that in the Perth Amateur Cycling Club, of which he was an enthusiastic member.
