Dear Mrs Kidwell,

You will have received
by now the news of your
husband, and I thought it
might set your mind at rest
somewhat if I wrote to tell you
that I was with him when he
was hit: he knew nothing
about it, for he was killed instant-
aneously, and I laid him to
rest soon afterwards, having
got together as many of his
personal friends as I could
find, including Mrs Hepburn.



His grave is situated in the corner
of a wood about 30 kilometres
North of Hannover, and just East
of the river Aller, near a village
called HADEMSTORF. We left
it in a very neat & orderly
condition and I hope to be able
to send you a photograph later.
Of course all these graves will
in due course be transferred
to a permanent British Military
Cemetery.

Trevor's personal kit
has been forwarded to England
and will reach you safely.
If there is anything in which
I can help you further, do
please write & let me know.

It is perhaps unnecessary to say
how deeply and sincerely both
I and all the men sympathise
with you. Trevor was extremely
popular with us all, for he was
so friendly and cheerful.

I wish with all my heart that
the whole wretched business of war
were over: I am convinced that
it is not God's will that our boys
should not be taken from us in
this way: and I thank Him that
He has the last word in spite of all.

May God bless and comfort you.
