Marine Reginald Day, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. Day, 5 Cliffe Street, Widnes, has died in hospital from wounds received in Italy. He volunteered for service on June 25th, 1941, and joined the Marine Commandos on the formation of that unit. He got

his baptism of action in the raid on Dieppe on August 19th, 1942, and later with the invasion forces into Sicily and Italy. He made various raids into Yugo-Slavia, and took part in the invasion of Greece. Returning to Italy for further operations, he was wounded on April 11th, and died of a fractured spine on April 12th.

In civil life Marine Day was employed at the Widnes dairy of the Runcorn and Widnes Cooperative Society, and was well known in the Farnworth district,
