called for service soon after hostilities commenced. He was medical officer with the Special Service Battalion that made the raid on the Norwegian coast about a year ago, and he was mentioned in despatches for distinguished service in that exploit. He has taken part in several raids since then while serving with the Commandos.

Capt. Corry is a well-known Rugby player and was with the Queen's University and North of Ireland teams. He also got his place in several Ulster sides. He was interested in boxing and was at one time light heavyweight champion at Queen's. His younger brother is serving with the Royal Artillery.

Before joining the Army Capt. Corry was for about two years on the medical staff of Down Infirmary.
